The City of Davis Historical Resources Management Commission GUIDELINES 2009 PRESERVATION APPRECIATION AWARDS

Preservation Appreciation Awards recognize organizations and individuals for outstanding contributions and commitment to excellence in local historic preservation. The awards are sponsored by the Historical Resources Management Commission (HRMC) to encourage organizations and individuals to restore and revitalize Davis' historic homes, buildings, structures, and neighborhoods and to support sensitive adaptive reuse. The awards also serve to promote awareness of the city's historical heritage.

QUALIFYING PROJECTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

1. An outstanding preservation project or a project which has had a significant impact on preservation of the built environment in the greater Davis area, or
2. Sustained contributions to historic preservation and the built environment in Davis. Projects or people in either the private or public sector are eligible, or
3. A volunteer, who with no expectations of recognition gives to the effort to preserve the built environment in Davis, or
4. Projects that preserve, restore, or reuse historic property in a way that is faithful to its architectural character, or
5. New construction that is strongly complementary to its historic neighborhood character.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Anyone may place a nomination. All nominations will be reviewed by the HRMC. Fill complete the information requested on the following nomination form (available on our web site or at the Hattie Weber Museum) and submit by Noon on Monday, April 13, 2009.

CEREMONIAL PRESENTATION

All winners will be honored at the 2009 Preservation Appreciation Award ceremonial presentation at a May 2009 City Council meeting.
