

2002 – 2003 CDBG/HOME APPLICANT QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

Project Title: Safe Harbor

- 1) Where does YCCC expect to raise the \$237,098 necessary for this project to be funded?

YCCC has requests in to the City of Davis and Woodland CDBG for funds. Several grants have been submitted to local foundations as well. In addition, YCCC is continuing with its fund raising efforts through a capital campaign.

- 2) When is ground breaking expected? Would Davis funds be expended in a timely manner?

The earliest we could break ground is the Spring of 2002, the latest planned ground breaking is Fall of 2002. The timing of starting construction is dependent on our ability to raise the funds necessary. The projected time lines for ground breaking would allow YCCC to expend the City of Davis funds in a timely manner.

Project Title: Day Program Transportation/ Haven House

- 1) How will the expansion of Safe Harbor affect the number of people needing to travel to Woodland for services.

Safe Harbor will not affect the number of people who receive day treatment services in Woodland. Safe Harbor is a short-term crisis residential program. Individuals stay from two to four weeks until their crisis is stabilized. Individuals being transported from Davis to Woodland live in Davis, and use Haven House Day Treatment as a tool for maintaining mental health and housing stability.

- 2) How many people regularly transported to Haven House are homeless?

YCCC transports about one or two people a year from the homeless shelter to Haven House. At Haven House we work with clients to find and maintain housing, so hopefully, these individuals do not remain homeless for long. As an example, last year we transported one individual from the Davis shelter to Haven House. At Haven House we helped him to access his benefits, found him supportive housing in Woodland, and gave him a job on our janitorial crew.

All of those transported, due to their income level, are considered to be at risk of homelessness.
