1. Describe in detail how your CDBG RFP differs from other CDBG RFP's.

The Sexual Assault & Domestic Violence Center receives CDBG funding from the City of Woodland and the County. County and Woodland CDBG funds are used to finance the comprehensive program located at the Wallace and Vanucci Shelter. Davis CDBG funds are used to provide services to victims of domestic violence living in Davis. Davis funds the Domestic Violence Response Team Advocate (DVRT) located at the Davis Police Department. The DVRT responds to police reports and provides the victims with services, resources and referrals so the client may make the choices they feel are right for them.

2. Describe in detail how your CDBG RFP supplements other CDBG RFP's.

The DAVIS CDBG funds provide funding for a unique program and do not supplement the CDBG funds we receive from the County or City of Woodland.

3. Describe in detail your efforts to coordinate with other CDBG agencies similar resources.

The DVRT position funded by Davis CDBG is a unique position. There are no other agencies that provide similar services. When a client is in need of referrals for supportive services, the DVRT makes referrals to STEAC, Davis Community Meals, and the Family Services Agency when appropriate.

4. Describe how you can lower the percentage of CDBG funding attributed to personnel and increase funding attributed to services to your CDBG beneficiaries. In your response, describe how increasing the percentage of any CDBG funding toward services would affect all other funding sources for your CDBG project.

The CDBG funding for this position is for direct services. The DVRT works directly with victims of violence from the City of Davis. She provides them with supportive services, referrals and resources to assist the client in their time of crisis.
