

Payment for Childcare

- Child care subsidy payments will be made directly to the licensed child care provider with whom an eligible family has contracted child care.
- Subsidies for the 2011-2012 Academic Year are projected to be based on the following quarterly amounts. These amounts may vary depending on available funding.

On-Campus Care

Full-time UCD Parent (s) (reimbursement at 50% of average market rate)	Part-time UCD Parent (s) (reimbursement at 75% of the full-time amount)

Off-Campus Care

- Students who receive the UC Davis Child Care Subsidy will have their information shared with the UC Davis Financial Aid offices. This may affect the child care assistance you receive from Financial Aid.
- Priorities for eligibility reflect the combined requirements of the various funding sources.
- Recipient of Pell Grant (First Priority), and/or
- Recipient of UC Davis Child Care Subsidy in previous spring quarter
- Returning to child care in fall quarter
- Have other children receiving on-campus care
- Not anticipating changes that will affect general eligibility

UC Davis Child Care Subsidy Program 2011-2012 Academic Year

The UC Davis Child Care Subsidy Program is designed to partially defray student families' child care expenses during the academic year. The program is funded by student registration fees, a federal grant (CCAMPIS) and contributions from Student Housing.

Eligibility Requirements

- Students enrolled at UC Davis full-time (12 or more quarter units for an undergraduate and 8 or more for a graduate or professional).
- In a two-adult family, the second adult must be a registered student and/or employed outside of the home full-time (40 hours a week).
- Child care must be needed for fall quarter. Families not needing care until winter or spring quarters will be added to the waiting list by date of application after families participating in the fall lottery.
- Participants must have physical custody of their child/ children and a need for care on the first day of the quarter.
- The subsidy will provide care for children birth to age 13.



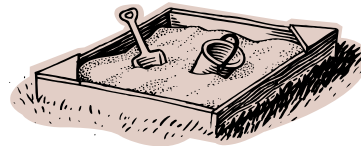
Second Priority Eligibility

- Part-time UC Davis students (less than 12 units for undergraduate and 8 units for graduate or professional) or full-time UCD students with spouses in school and/or employed only part-time will be considered for enrollment after all full-time students are served.
- Part-time employment must be no less than 20 hours per week.
- Part-time students will receive 75% of the subsidy allowed for full-time students.

On-Campus Care

- The CCAMPIS federal grant targets Pell Grant recipients and restricts subsidies to child care provided at NAEYC accredited centers under the oversight of the university. Currently all centers on campus meet the qualifications.
- Pell recipients meeting all eligibility requirements will receive priority to enroll.

Off-Campus Care

- The UC Davis subsidy funding consisting of registration fee and contributions from Student Housing allows families to use the licensed child care provider of their choice.
- Subsidies will be for care of Kindergarten and school-age children only.
- Priority will be given to families whose other children are enrolled in on-campus care.

Program Enrollment

1. Applications are available at the City of Davis Child Care Services office and on-line at: <http://www.hr.ucdavis.edu/worklife-wellness/Life/childcare/financial-assistance>
2. Students meeting the following criteria will be granted pre-qualified status in the UC Davis Child Care Subsidy Program upon receipt of their application on or before 3:00pm on Wednesday, August 31, 2011 at the City of Davis Child Care Services office.
3. Students who do not meet the criteria for pre-qualification may apply for the fall administrative lottery to be held mid-September. Awards will depend upon the availability of funds remaining after pre-qualified applicants have been processed. Applications not selected for fall quarter will be placed on a waiting list in the order they were drawn in the lottery.
4. Neither pre-qualification nor drawing of a specific application number in the administrative lottery guarantees a subsidy. To receive an award, students must attend an in-person interview to confirm program eligibility. All necessary documentation of income and need for child care must be submitted by the date specified during the verification process.
5. Applications received after the lottery will be assigned a place on the waiting list according to the eligibility priority and date and time of receipt. Applications are pulled from the waiting list during the academic year as openings occur in the program.
