Potential Large Scale Emergencies

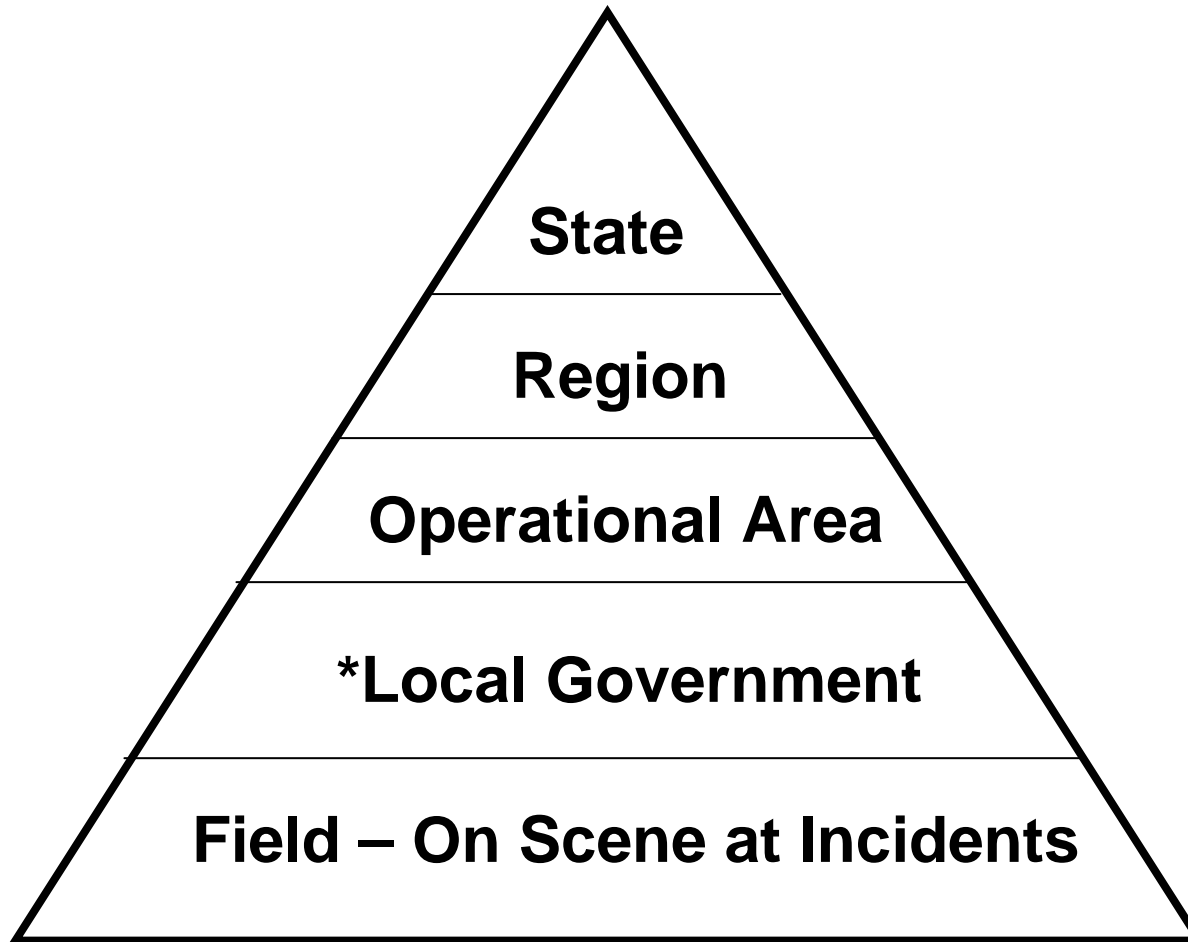
SEMS/NIMS

- Common organization, terminology and resource management systems
- Efficiently supports tactical (field) operations at disaster scene

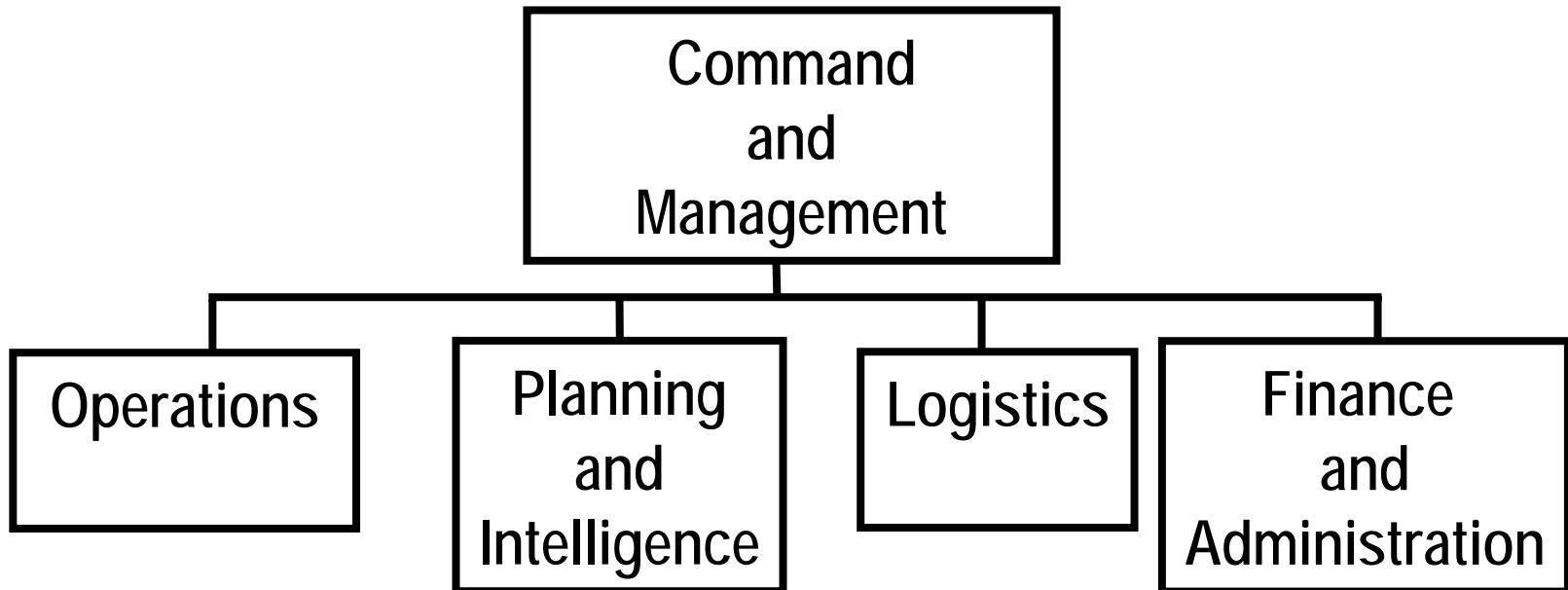
5 Levels of Emergency Organization

Emergency Operations Center

This EOC organization is known as the Incident Command System or simply ICS



Department Operations Center

Each department coordinates the resources and operations to fulfill the goals of EOC
