# When your dog should be on a leash

**D**avis residents often ask city personnel about the requirements of our local leash laws. They're uncertain about when and where dogs can be allowed to run free, and when they must be tethered. If you're unsure, you don't have to hound city officials, because you can read about the leash laws here.

The city of Davis requires all dogs to be on a leash except when on private property or when the dog is in a designated off-leash area. Leashes should not exceed eight feet in length. Yolo County Animal Services enforces the leash law and other animal regulations.

To accommodate owners who like to let their dogs run and play freely without a leash, the city of Davis has designated several off-leash areas. Two of these sites are fenced facilities, but most are unfenced with signage marking the permissible off-leash area.

Unfenced off-leash areas (with boundaries marked by signage):

- Aspen Greenbelt, near Glacier Drive and Isle Royale Lane
- Pioneer Park, 5035 Hamel St.
- Slide Hill Park, 1525 Tulip Lane
- Sycamore Park, 1313 Sycamore Lane

■ Walnut Park, 2700 Lillard Drive.

Fenced off-leash areas:

■ Community Park, 1405 F St. (west of the Skate Park)

■ Toad Hollow Dog Park, 1919 Second St. Caretakers are required to clean up after their dogs, regardless of whether the

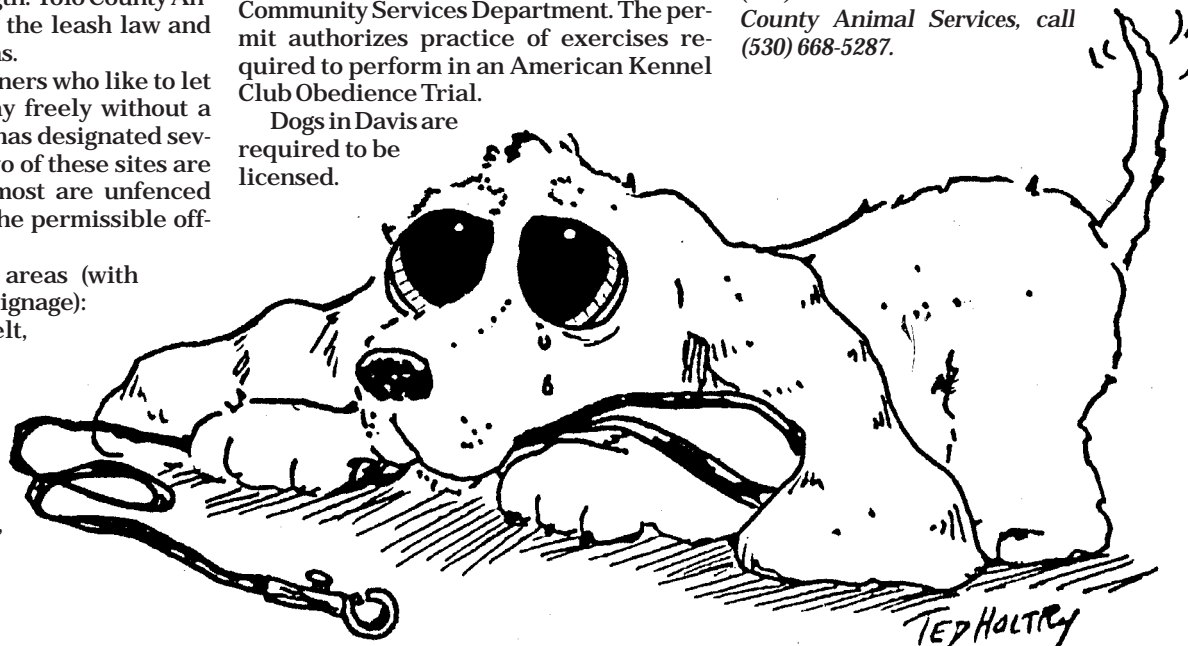
dogs are leashed or unleashed. Dogs are not allowed in children's play areas within city parks and greenbelts.

For dogs involved in obedience training and showing in trials, an off-leash training permit is available through the Parks & Community Services Department. The permit authorizes practice of exercises required to perform in an American Kennel Club Obedience Trial.

Dogs in Davis are required to be licensed.

A Yolo County Dog License may be purchased or renewed at the Yolo County Animal Shelter, 41831 Gibson Road, Woodland. New licenses may be purchased at the Davis Police Department, 2600 Fifth St. A current rabies certificate is required, and licenses are sold at half price with proof that the animal has been spayed or neutered.

# Davis Municipal Golf Course buildings have a new look

**I**f you have visited the Davis Municipal Golf Course lately, you've seen some big changes. The buildings at the 42-year-old course, where over 63,000 rounds of golf are played every year, have been renovated. The course and buildings located at Road 29 and

Highway 113 are now more accessible to visitors with disabilities.

The seven-month project, under direction of the Parks and Community Services Department, included construction of new roofs, siding and handicapped-accessible restrooms. Now that the old restroom building has been removed, golfers have a spectacular view of the 18th green from the new patio area. Parking spaces and a golf cart have been designated for people with disabilities.

Construction funding was derived from development impact fees and block grant money. The city raised the revenue for the golf course renovation without increasing greens fees or spending city general fund tax dollars. Greens fees are intentionally kept as low as possible to make the course affordable for seniors and teens.
