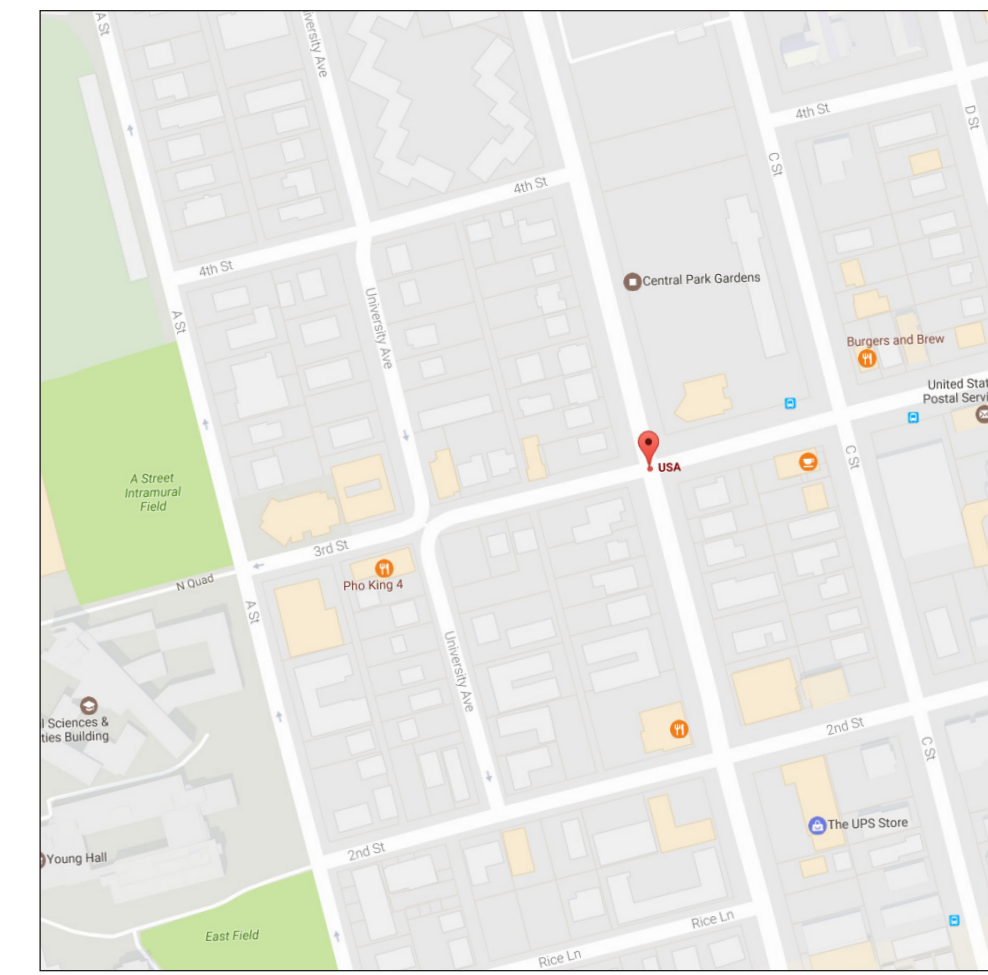
Wayfinding hubs are destinations that establish points of orientation, connections, and markers along the bike ways and pathways



Parks and greenbelts

Not specific, more general location, multiple access points. For example:

- Arroyo Park
- Playfields Park
- Wildhorse greenbelt



Streets

Very specific, space constraints at busy intersections. For example:

- 14th and B Street
- 3rd and B Street
- Cowell Blvd. and Lillard Avenue



Schools

Reasonably specific, location needs to be on adjacent public property. For example:

- Patwin Elementary
- Harper Junior High
- Davis Senior High



Public amenities

Reasonably specific, multiple entrances and buildings in one location. For example:

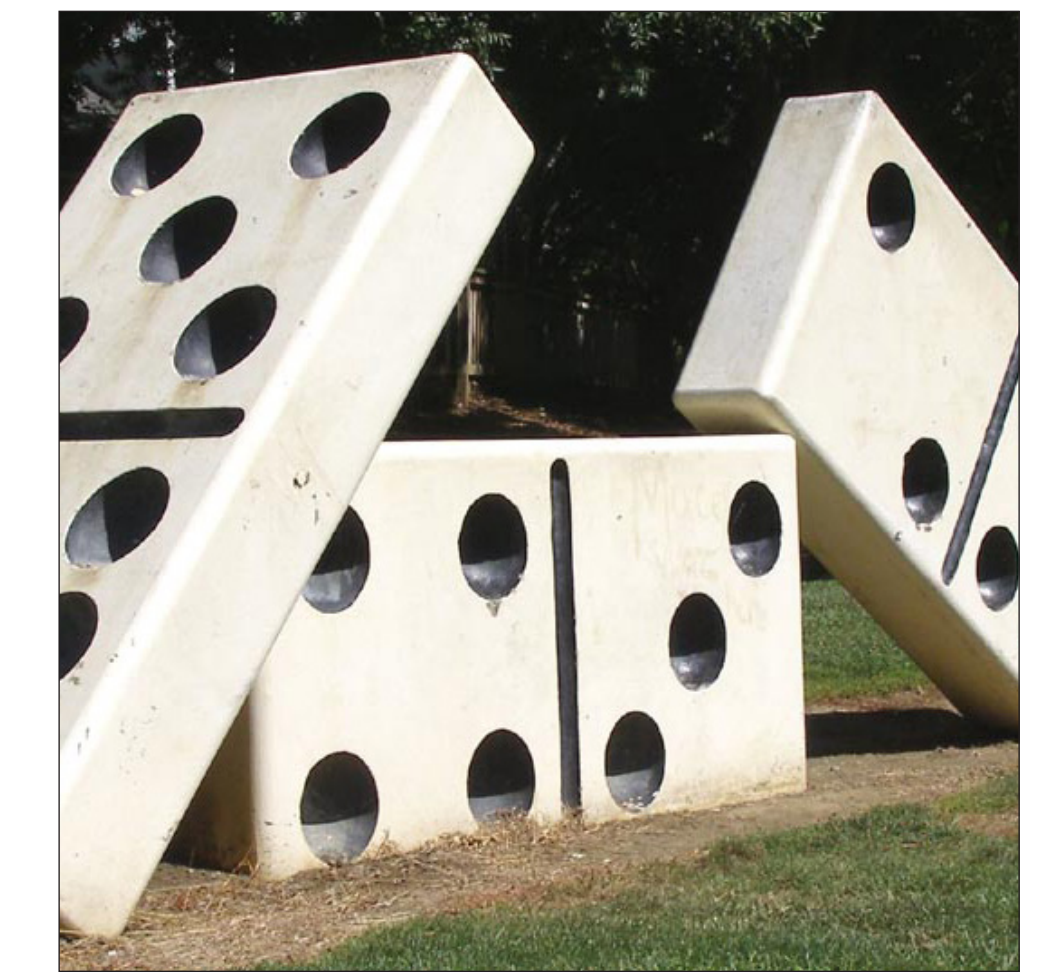
- Public Library
- Veterans Memorial Center
- Train Station



Shopping centers

Not specific, hard to navigate, location needs to be on adjacent public property. For example:

- Davis Commons
- Anderson Plaza
- University Mall



Features / Landmarks

Very specific, not marked on existing maps, harder to find. For example:

- Davis water tower
- Art installations
- Farmers Market
