



## City of Davis Notice of Public Hearing

The City of Davis **Planning Commission** will conduct a public hearing on the project application, as described below, at a meeting beginning at **7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 8, 2017**, in the Community Chambers, City Offices, 23 Russell Boulevard, Davis, California. Please contact the Department of Community Development and Sustainability for the approximate time this item will be heard.

**Project Name:** Zoning Ordinance Amendments Related to Marijuana/Cannabis Uses

**Project Location:** Citywide, in all zoning districts

**Applicant:** City of Davis

**File Number:** Planning Application #17-11, Zoning Ordinance Amendment #1-17

### **Project Description:**

Amendments to City's zoning ordinance pertaining to marijuana uses within the City are proposed to provide local regulatory authority over marijuana uses consistent with State law. Proposed amendments will propose the regulation or prohibition of activities related to non-commercial, personal use, indoor and outdoor marijuana cultivation in residential zones. Proposed regulatory measures may include but are not limited to: limiting cultivation to personal use, limiting the number of plants, regulating the location of planting(s), including indoor and/or outdoor in rear and side yards, setbacks and potential performance standards for indoor and outdoor cultivation.

Other proposed regulatory measures pertaining to other marijuana uses will be considered by the Planning Commission for inclusion in future ordinance(s) to be proposed by the City. These may include but are not limited to regulations for locations of businesses that propose manufacture of marijuana products such as extraction, edibles, creams lotions and the like, testing and research, commercial cultivation, processing, storage and distribution facilities for medical and/or recreational use marijuana, the locations of and regulations regarding marijuana dispensaries, regulating mobile dispensaries, including prohibiting or permitting or conditionally permitting the location of "home base" of the mobile dispensary within the City, and/or licensing and/or zoning permits required for permitted activities, and establishing performance standard for these and other related marijuana land uses.

**Environmental Determination:**

Based on the proposal before Planning Commission, it is proposed that the zoning amendments related to non-commercial outdoor cultivation in residential zones will be exempt from CEQA. All other proposed amendments would come back to the Planning Commission for consideration at a later date at which time the environmental review of the proposed amendments would also be considered.
