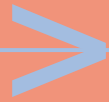

The Code Compliance Coordinator works through the Community Development Department and receives complaints regarding violations of City Codes/Ordinances. This includes the following types of complaints:

- Zoning Violations
- Commercial Violations
- Building Violations
- Business License Violations
- Visual Blight on Private Property
- Graffiti Hotline (530) 757-5600

Code Compliance will contact the owner or tenants of the property in question in order to facilitate problem resolution.

NOTE: Code Compliance has a form that may be handed out or mailed to citizens. This form is called Request for Investigation/Complaint Form. This form is also available online. It can be turned into the City Code Compliance unit or submitted electronically for further investigation.

## Illegal Littering/Dumping

The Davis Police Dispatch Center handles after hours emergency calls for Parks and Community Services. The response is based on emergencies reported by public safety or citizens. All non-emergency items will be handled during regular business hours.

Parks & Community Services may be called out for the following types of reports:

- Tree emergencies (includes tree limbs, trees down, tree hazards)
- Irrigation systems (running for more than 45 minutes)
- Emergency repairs of city swimming pools
- Emergency repairs of athletic fields and tennis courts in parks
- City building emergency repairs or maintenance
- Broken playground equipment in parks or greenbelts

## Public Works

The Davis Police Dispatch Center handles after hours emergency calls for Public Works. This includes calls for traffic lights, water sewer, streets, and the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The response is based on emergencies reported by public safety or citizens. Listed below are some examples of the types of emergencies possibly requiring an after-hours response. All non-emergency items will be handled during regular business hours.

### TRAFFIC LIGHTS/WATER/SEWER/STREETS

- Traffic signals (damaged or malfunctioning)
- Street light knockdowns
- Broken water lines or mains
- Fire hydrants
- Sewer stoppages or backups
- Serious flooding
- Serious street hazards (accident damage, missing maintenance hole covers or drainage gates)
- Missing or damaged regulatory signs (such as STOP, YIELD)
- Private property plumbing emergencies (city water service needs to be turned off for repairs)

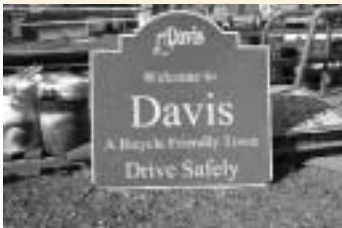

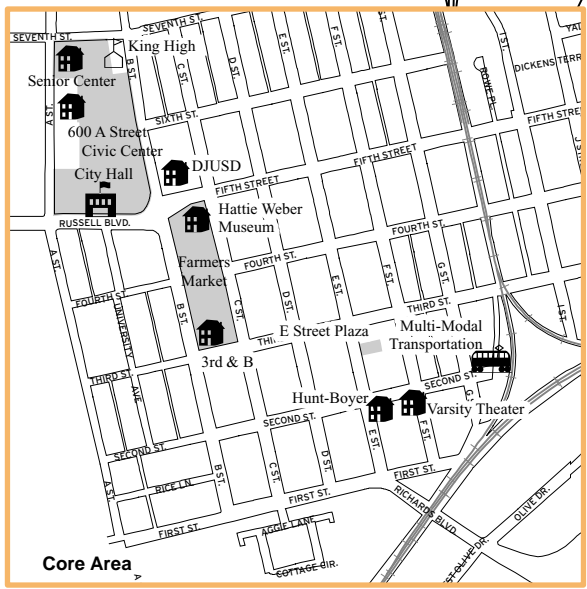
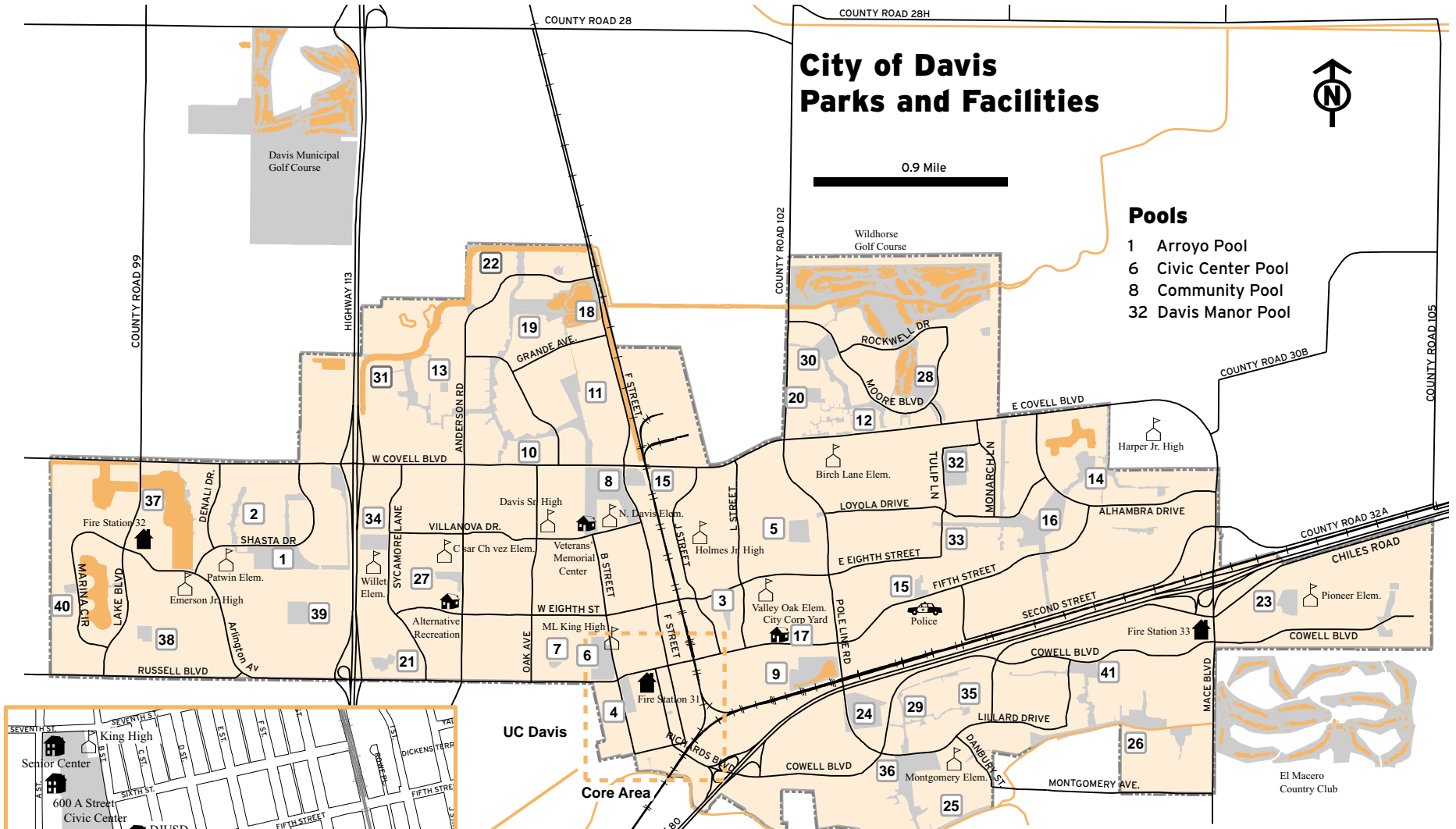
