**Chief's Update**

There was an ambitious agenda set for this meeting; however the person who requested the topics for discussion was not present. It was decided that CAB would have a more casual meeting with a Chief's Update and Round Table.

A new university student representative needs to be selected. Pat will contact the ASUCD about this.

Chief Black reported on events surrounding the tragic loss of Detective Paul Narr and talked about his career at the PD which embodied the community policing philosophy. He said this incident has brought attention to the need to help staff learn how to deal with stress and get help if needed. Suicide has become alarmingly frequent in law enforcement. EAP counselors and Woodland chaplains were available at the department throughout the week of August 11 – 15.

A memorial service for Detective Narr will be held on Friday, August 15 at 2:30 p.m. at the First Baptist Church on Russell Boulevard, Davis.

Officer Trevor Edens has been released by his doctors to return to Patrol full time. He worked hard as his accident was only eight months ago. This is excellent news for Edens and the Police Department.

**Round Table**

Diane McGee reported that "Stand Up for Cancer" is sponsoring a television program which will air on all major networks on September 5, to raise money for cancer research. The group is encouraging people to have potlucks with friends and neighbors to watch the program together.

Diane McGee is working with Project Linus and will be the drop off person for groups and individuals who make blankets and quilts for children or are sick or in need. They also take the blankets to crisis organizations. Diane will talk with Youth Intervention Specialist Petersen about donating to the Police Department for officers to have on hand for children. The Sacramento Chapter distributed 6,000 blankets last year.

Patti Fong reported that in the Sacramento trial of a Russian man who killed a Pacific Islander, the jury did not find it to be a hate crime.

Scott Wieking reported that plans have begun for the coming year's Inter Faith Rotating Winter Shelter. They will expand the months that the churches are opening their doors. It will begin in November.
