Don't trash good stuff



The safest and most effective way to ensure your reusable stuff reaches people who need it is to keep it out of the dumpster by selling, donating or giving usable items away instead.

Donate or sell unwanted items

- **Post items for sale or for free online** Consider using Facebook, Sacramento Craigslist, Davis Freecycle or other online group to post things for sale or for free
- **Host a yard sale** See if your neighbors want to join in and have a community-wide sale!
- **Donate items to a local thrift store** Local thrift stores accept a wide variety of reusable items. See the list of local thrift stores and donation drop-off sites below. Please call to verify drop-off times and if they are currently accepting items.

Recycle stuff that can't be reused

Not everything can be reused. Please be a good environmental steward when you move and recycle as much as you can.

Hazardous Waste It is against California State law to place hazardous waste items in the trash, not to mention dangerous! Bring batteries, fluorescent bulbs and tubes, household cleaners and other toxic products to the Yolo County Central Landfill hazardous waste facility for free and safe disposal every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.



Mattresses and box springs These items can be recycled for FREE at these locations:

- Yolo County Central Landfill, see details below
 - Recology Davis, 2727 2nd St. Mattresses are accepted Monday to Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- * Memory foam mattresses, pillows, crib mattresses, air mattresses and sofa beds are not accepted for recycling. These should be placed in the trash or taken to the landfill.

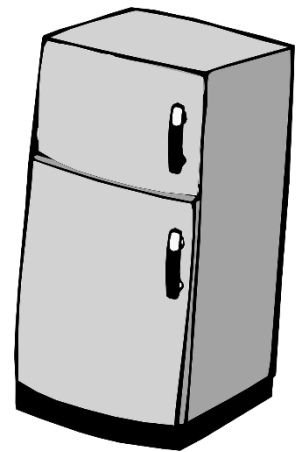
Electronics

Computer monitors, TVs and laptops and all other items with a cord or that run on batteries contain toxic materials and cannot be put in the trash. Recycle your electronics for free at the Yolo County Central Landfill, see details below.



Refrigerators

It is illegal to place refrigerators and freezers in the trash. Recycle them at the Yolo County Central Landfill, fees will apply.

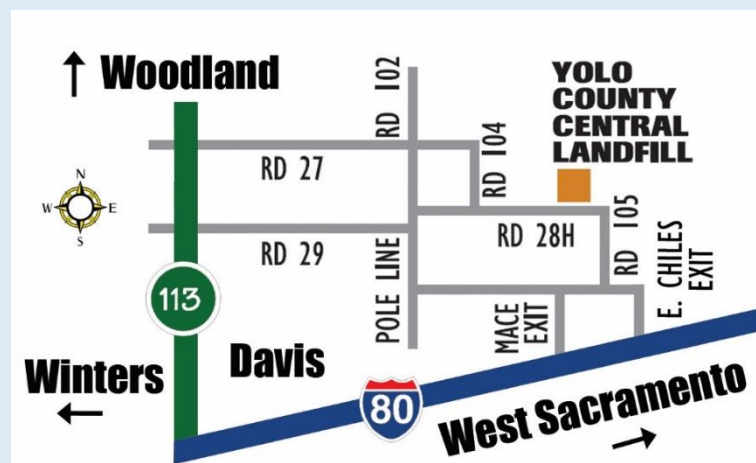
