





Citywide Expenditures





General Fund Sources and Uses












General Fund Revenue Projection COVID-19 Impact





Grant Funding

- Since 2017, City has received \$25 mil in grant funding; \$6.3 mil currently pending
- 2020 funding included funding for flood mitigation, open space, business support, parks & playgrounds enhancement, resources for the unhoused
- City maintains a grant inventory and a three-year funding plan with a grant matching fund

- 3 test sites now open customers & staff
- Resources to safely quarantine and isolate
- HDT Partners offering reimbursement grants and gift card incentive programs
- Communication of good health practices



HDT Business Partners Program Highlights

- 2 program coordinators working 40 hours/week
- 10 team members ("ambassadors") working approximately 20 hours/week
- 109 confirmed business partners
- 856 total businesses contacted (at least once) by an ambassador
- 1,483 total ambassador contacts to businesses
- Business support grant applications in process
- Gift cards being purchased and in process of being distributed












Construction Projects on the Horizon

City Pavement Plan


- City has a substantial investment in the street and bike path network (\$308 Million)
- Allocated maintenance funding at \$5.1 million was insufficient
- Pavement subcommittee has identified solutions to close the funding gap and achieve target pavement conditions – bike paths at \$12.2 mil over 10 yrs and streets at \$70 mil over 10 yrs
