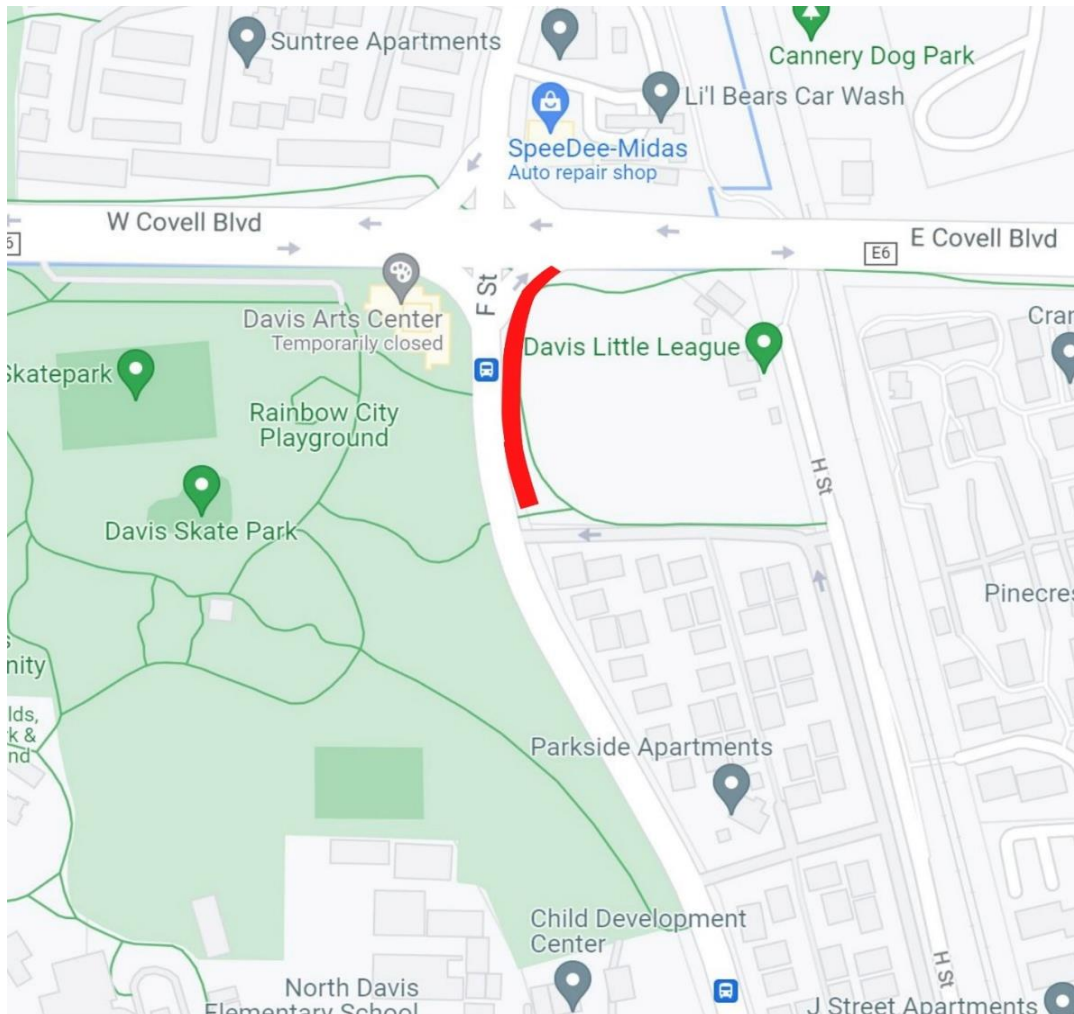


The intersection where the public art site is located includes [Davis Arts Center](#) to the west, the [Davis Little League](#) fields to the east, and residential and commercial properties. It extends to a path in one direction that crosses over the Union Pacific freight railroad tracks operated by the **California Northern Railroad**, and in the other direction curves around the baseball fields, and under the roadway, connecting with **The Cannery**. The Cannery occupies the former [Hunt Wesson Plant](#) site, historically home to the production of tomato canning. The Cannery is a mixed-use neighborhood center that includes varied housing, a working urban farm, nearly 30 acres of parks and open space, and a future Market Hall commercial property.

The public art location is also immediately adjacent to **Community Park**, which houses the **Mary L. Stephens-Davis Branch Library**, **North Davis Elementary School**, **Davis Senior High School**, and the **Veterans Memorial Community Center and Theatre**.

*Map of site and surroundings. Red line delineates the primary location for art installation:*



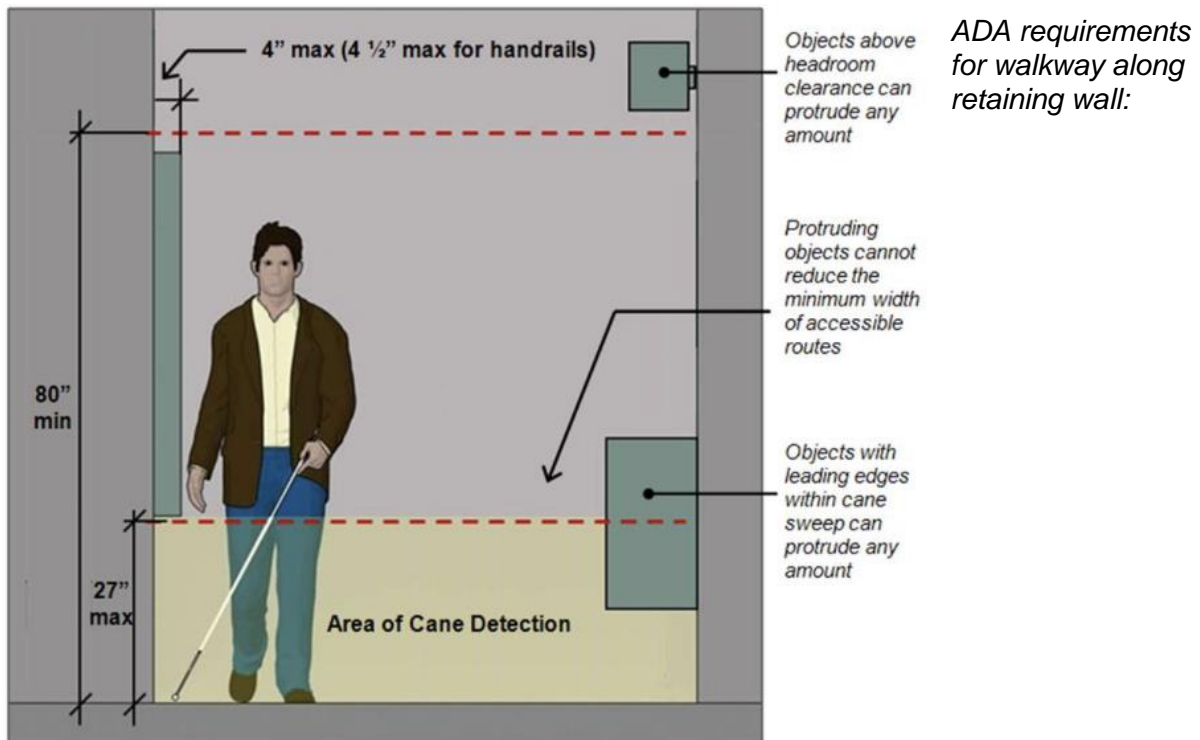
*Panoramic of site-- large retaining wall on the southeast corner of F St. and Covell Blvd.:*
