California Fair Maps Act

Open and Fair redistricting process

The Fair Maps Act passed by the Legislature mandates a set of criteria we must follow when drawing district plans.

- Relatively equal size people, not citizens
- Contiguous districts should not hop/jump
- Maintain "communities of interest"
- Follow city and census designated place boundaries
- Keep districts compact appearance/function



Community of Interest Testimony

Open and Fair redistricting process

The City received 21 comments on the web form posted on the City's redistricting website.

 All 21 comments focused on Aggie Village and grouping it with similar neighborhoods



From COI to Maps

With more cities and counties using community based redistricting, we move redistricting out into the public, with maps driven by Community of Interest testimony.

- Input from community drives process with multiple ways for the public to engage.
- Rules for process emphasize the importance of traditional criteria and minimizing divisions of neighborhoods.
- Releasing maps for feedback today we will see plans to spark more public engagement.










Draft Map A was created based on minimal changes from the current lines:

- District 1 pushed eastward beyond Hwy 113, to include more of the Central Davis Neighborhood
- District 2 pushed eastward to include all of the North Davis Neighborhood
- District 3 pushed westward to include more of Central Davis Neighborhood and southward to include the census blocks south of 1st Street
- District 4 remains the same as in the current lines
- District 5 receded slightly, losing the census blocks south of 1st St.





Draft Plan A with Neighborhoods






Draft Map B has minimum change from the current lines with a lower deviation.

- District 1 pushed eastward beyond Hwy 113, to include more of the Central Davis Neighborhood from Plan A
- District 2 pushed eastward to include all of the North Davis Neighborhood
- District 3 pushed westward to include more of Central Davis Neighborhood from Plan A and southward to include the census blocks south of 1st Street
- District 4 remains the same as in the current lines
- District 5 receded slightly, losing the census blocks south of 1st St.





Draft Plan B with Neighborhoods






Draft Map C was created by altering Map A to shift the cannery area:

- District 1 pushed eastward beyond Hwy 113, to include more of the Central Davis Neighborhood (same as in Plan A)
- District 2 pushed eastward to include all of the North Davis Neighborhood and include the Cannery
- District 3 pushed westward to include more of Central Davis Neighborhood and southward to include the census blocks south of 1st Street
- District 4 remains the same as in the current lines (same as in Plan A)
- District 5 receded slightly, losing the census blocks south of 1st St. (same as in Plan A)





Acceleration and Deferral

Acceleration

In an election system where there are staggered, four-year terms with elections every two years, a redistricting can result where a person who just recently elected a representative is moved into a new district where they can again choose an elected representative. Their opportunity to vote has been accelerated by two years.

Deferral

Is the opposite situation. Its when a person's opportunity to vote has been deferred by two years.





Acceleration and Deferrals within Draft Map A.

Acceleration

- 754 people accelerated into District 1
- 3 people accelerated into District 4

Deferral

• 68 people deferred into District 2





Acceleration and Deferrals within Draft Map B.

Acceleration

- 1,336 people accelerated into District 1
- 3 people accelerated into District 4

Deferral

909 people deferred into District 2





Acceleration and Deferrals within Draft Map C.

Acceleration

- 754 people accelerated into District 1
- 3 people accelerated into District 4

Deferral

- 68 people deferred into District 2
- 253 people deferred into District 3
